

### About Saint Bernard of Clairvaux (1090 - 1153)

Saint Bernard was born near Dijon, in France, in 1090 to a noble family. In 1112 he joined the monastery at Cîteaux. This monastery had been founded fourteen years before as a means of rejecting the laxity and riches of the Benedictine Order (for example, the great monastery at Cluny) and to return to a primitive and austere lifestyle in monasticism.

Bernard arrived at Cîteaux with four of his five brothers and twenty-four friends. Within three years he was sent out to Clairvaux, in Champagne, to found a new monastery. He was the abbot there for the rest of his life. When he died, the Cistercian Order had grown from one house to 343.

Saint Bernard was a man of great holiness and wisdom, and very often found himself in poor health. However, he did not let his health problems prevent him from being active in the life of the Church. He was continually active in the public debates of his day and was clear in his opposition to the luxurious lifestyle of some of the clergy of his day and fought against the persecution of the Jews. He was also a prolific writer, of an inspiring rather than a technical kind.

## How does the life of Saint Bernard apply to our lives today?

Saint Bernard jam-packed a lot into his earthly life. He did not wait for an invitation to do something, he just did it and invited others to follow him. He was a leader. He did not let poor health prevent him from doing God's work or proclaiming the gospel message. He was a man of his convictions and sought to renew the Church with his followers in his monasteries. So let our words, deeds and positive lifestyle imitate Saint Bernard and be a leader for Christ, bringing others to follow and know Him by our example, not by long-winded doctrinal lessons.

Saint Bernard very much tried to save the Church in his time from corruption by his program of renewal. We must always ensure that we renew our commitment to Christ every day by our lifestyle and do our best to make sure it is in accord with the teachings and way of Christ.

# Prayer: Memorare


