About Saints Cornelius and Cyprian

Pope St Cornelius (d. 253)

Cornelius was elected pope in Rome in the year 251. He fought against the Novatian schismatics and established his authority with the aid of Cyprian. Together with Cyprian he defended the power of the Church to reconcile those who had lapsed under persecution. He decided that those Christians who renounced their faith under the persecution of the Roman authorities should be welcomed back into the Church. With a compassionate heart, Cornelius declared that those individuals could return to the Church after a period of penance.

The emperor Gallus sent him into exile, and he died at Civitavecchia in June 253. He is buried in Rome.

St Cyprian (210 - 258)

Saint Cyprian was born in Carthage and spent most of his life practicing law. He converted to Christianity and was made bishop of Carthage in the year 249. He guided the Church through difficult times, including the persecution of the Emperor Decius, when Cyprian was forced into hiding to be able to continue his ministry. In the year 258 the persecution of the Emperor Valerian began. Cyprian was exiled and was executed on 14 September of that year.

How do the lives of Saints Cornelius and Cyprian apply to our lives today?

Both these men suffered a martyr's death, but they remained constant in their faith in Christ and did not let troubling times prevent them from fulfilling their priestly ministry, offering pastoral care and support to people or doing good.

Saint Cyprian's trial was noted for the calm and courtesy displayed on both sides. Even in the time of trial, Cyprian remained calm.

Both these men realized that we are not perfect and sometimes we fail. They recognized that forgiveness and reconciliation are a necessary part of belonging to the Church and their actions certainly displayed their positive attitude towards members of the flock.

May we pray for those who persecute us and never cease trying to do good for others.
