# Saints Cosmas and Damian (Martyrs) 26 September



### About Saints Cosmas and Damian (+303)

Not a great deal is known about these two men. They came from Aleppo in Syria and lived lives of holiness. They are buried at Cyrrhus in Syria, where a basilica was constructed in their honour. At their tomb, devotion to them flourished and many miracles are said to have taken place. They are honoured throughout the Mediterranean basin, where they were patrons of a church dedicated by Pope Felix IV in the ancient Roman Forum. These two men are mentioned in the First Eucharistic Prayer in the list of Saints. Tradition considers that these two men were medical doctors and twins, who did not take money for their services. They became known as *anargyoi*, which means moneyless ones or moneyless healers.

They were vibrant in their Christian faith and were arrested during the persecution of Diocletian. When they refused to renounce the Christian faith and engage in idolatrous worship they were beheaded, and their bodies were cast into the sea.

## How can we apply Saints Cosmas and Damian's life to our lives today?

These two men really lived their Christian life with joy, never counting the cost of loving and serving God and neighbour. They lived in a time of great persecution in the Church: the Emperor Diocletian executed more Christians in his reign than all the other Emperors put together. He was indeed a ruthless and cruel man. Yet these two men stood up for God and were unwavering in their faith. Like them, we must have the courage to stand up for what is right and not be afraid to profess our faith in Christ, the Son of the Living God. Let us also look for opportunities to help people in need, not seeking praise, but by doing works quietly behind the scenes and the Lord will be sure to take care of us and our needs.
