Leader's Notes

Advent comes from a Latin word adventus, which means 'coming'. It is the time when we get ready and wait for the coming of baby Jesus at Christmas. Christmas is a time of joy and gifts. We look forward to the gifts we receive at Christmas, but we also need to remember that giving is just as important as receiving.

Advent Wreath

Today we are going to light the first candle of the Advent Wreath as we get ready for the birth of Jesus at Christmas.

Jesus said to his disciples: "Watch out and be ready!

He tells each of them what to do,

and he orders the watchmen to be on their guard.

"So be on your guard!

You don't know when the master of the house will come back.

It could be in the evening or at midnight or before dawn or in the

morning.

But if he comes suddenly, don't let him find you asleep.

I tell everyone just what I have told you.

Be on your guard!"

Jesus asks us to 'watch out and be ready!' How do you prepare and be ready when you know someone special is coming to visit? (clean, prepare food and drink, make up bed if they are staying). Just as we prepare our homes for when we have special visitors, we need to prepare our hearts and lives for Jesus. How do you think we can prepare ourselves for Jesus? (be kind to each other, share, help parents etc). Ask each child to focus on one thing they can do during this coming week to prepare for Jesus.

By living each day as Jesus taught us, filled with goodness and love, we will be ready to welcome him when he comes again.

Gospel Mark 1:1-8 (CEV)

Leader: A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark.

This is the good news about Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

It began just as God had said

in the book written by Isaiah the prophet,

"I am sending my messenger to get the way ready for you.

In the desert someone is shouting,

'Get the road ready for the Lord!

Make a straight path for him."

So John the Baptist showed up in the desert and told everyone,

"Turn back to God and be baptised!

Then your sins will be forgiven."

From all Judea and from Jerusalem crowds of people went to John.

They told how sorry they were for their sins,

and he baptised them in the Jordan River.

John wore clothes made of camel's hair.

He had a leather strap around his waist

and ate grasshoppers and wild honey.

John also told the people,

"Someone more powerful is going to come.

And I am not good enough even to stoop down and untie his

sandals. I baptise you with water,

but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit!"

Today's Gospel is again about getting ready. Getting ready for Jesus' birth at Christmas. We get ready by thinking about our actions during the week. When we behave as Jesus wants us to, we are on the path to him. Ask the children to reflect on their behaviour during the week. Did they behave as Jesus would? Jesus always forgives us when we are sorry for our actions. Did someone hurt us? Were we forgiving like Jesus? Ask how will they change their behaviour this week to prepare for Jesus coming at Christmas?

By living each day as Jesus taught us, filled with goodness and love, we will be ready to welcome him when he comes at Christmas.

Leader: A reading from the holy gospel according to John.

He told them plainly, "I am not the Messiah." Then when they asked him if he were Elijah,

he said, "No, I am not!"

And when they asked if he were the Prophet,

he also said "No!"

Finally, they said, "Who are you then?

We have to give an answer to the ones who sent us.

Tell us who you are!"

John answered in the words of the prophet Isaiah,

"I am only someone shouting in the desert,

'Get the road ready for the Lord!'"

Some Pharisees had also been sent to John.

They asked him, "Why are you baptising people,

if you are not the Messiah or Elijah or the Prophet?"

John told them, "I use water to baptise people.

But here with you is someone you don't know.

Even though I came first,

Today's Gospel is again about getting ready. Getting ready for Jesus birth at Christmas. The road is also mentioned again today. John (Jesus' disciple) says 'get the road ready for the Lord'. We are on the road to Jesus when we act as he would. Let's think about our actions during the past week. Ask the children to reflect on their behaviour during the week. Did they behave as Jesus would? Jesus always forgives us when we are sorry for our actions. What will they do this week to get ready for Jesus? By living each day as Jesus taught us, filled with goodness and love, we will be ready to welcome him when he comes at Christmas.

Paper candle – draw a road on the candle and on it record the child's focus for the week.

Gospel Luke 1:26-38 (CEV)

Leader: A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke.

God sent the angel Gabriel to the town of Nazareth in Galilee

with a message for a virgin named Mary.

She was engaged to Joseph from the family of King David.

The angel greeted Mary and said,

"You are truly blessed! The Lord is with you."

Mary was confused by the angel's words

and wondered what they meant.

Then the angel told Mary, "Don't be afraid!

God is pleased with you, and you will have a son.

His name will be Jesus.

He will be great and will be called the Son of God Most High.

The Lord God will make him king,

as his ancestor David was.

He will rule the people of Israel forever,
