INTRODUCTION

Welcome to another year of *The Musician's Monthly*. Last year I continued to focus on different paragraphs from *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, but I interrupted that series of reflections for the Christmas edition of the newsletter in December. I am going to take *Sacrosanctum Concilium* up again in this edition of the newsletter. In the November Newsletter I began looking at the articles on Sacred Music and I will continue that topic in this Newsletter. That focus will probably see us through to the end of this year.

On page 4 of this issue I have listed all the workshops for February-July this year. You will notice the workshop on Music for Holy Week will be our first workshop for February. It can be difficult to schedule and attend workshops early in the year, but we are always mindful here at the CFL of looking ahead so that you can select and prepare your music well ahead of time.

Speaking of workshops, at the time of writing we plan to have a soft entry to on-site workshops. For the most part, since the pandemic hit in March 2020, we have offered workshops by Zoom from the Centre for Liturgy. We really don't know what will happen with this pandemic and we could have a snap lockdown at any time. So, plan A for at least the first part of 2023 is to run the workshops here at the Centre with 6 people on-site and other people joining us by Zoom. We will trial this plan till June this year and see how it works and where we are with the COVID-19 virus at that point. Therefore, as we have been for the past two years, we are going to be very flexible with our workshop schedule. Situations that arise may cause workshops to be cancelled at the last minute, but we will do our best to advise you ahead of time.

We will also be holding a workshop where we teach the setting of the Easter Proclamation in The Roman Missal. This setting is the only setting to be used and we feel that in order to justice to teaching and learning the Easter Proclamation, a workshop dedicated solely to that is best rather than including it in the Music for Holy Week Workshop. This workshop will be held later this month.

Copyright is not the most interesting of topics to discuss, but it is one that requires us to have an awareness of its implications for us as liturgical musicians. We will be holding

two workshops on this topic. The second workshop in July will be a repeat of the first being held next month (see the list of workshops on page 4).

Last year our main focus for the music workshops was the musical settings of the English translation of the Third Edition of The Roman Missal. We hope people have learned some quality musical settings of the Ordinary of the Mass to use in their communities.

Parish musicians may have particular needs and Chris and I are happy to assist you in any way we can. You may like to organize a Zoom group or an on-site workshop in your parish for us to teach you particular pieces of music. You can contact me on music.cfl@perthcatholic.org.au.

The Liturgical Calendar for this month and next month which I have published in the newsletter reminds us that the Season of Lent is near. It seems like we just finished Christmas and here we are at Lent and making preparations for Holy Week and Easter. (Hence, the workshop on Music for Holy Week is so early on!) Time doesn't stand still, especially for a liturgical musician!

Speaking of the Liturgical Calendar there are a couple of items I would like to bring to your attention. Firstly, Sunday 5 February (Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time) has been designated as Word of God Sunday. Setting aside a Sunday as the Word of God Sunday is intended to encourage the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God. Hymns that are suitable for Word of God Sunday have been included in the list for the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time and are highlighted in yellow.

Secondly, Lent will soon be upon us, with Ash Wednesday falling on 22 February this year. The last Sunday before Ash Wednesday will be the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time (Sunday 19 February). That Sunday is an opportunity to 'farewell the Alleluia', as it will be the last Sunday with Alleluias before they return during the Easter Vigil. I would encourage you to sing a hymn with Alleluias in it at the end of Mass on that Sunday and some suitable suggestions are given in the music list for that day and have been highlighted. If you would like to farewell the Alleluia before Lent, then here is a link to a Hymn for Shrove Tuesday. It can be sung to the tune of 'Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven': <https://liturgy.co.nz/worship-resources/shrove>

Also, on the last Sunday in Ordinary Time before Ash Wednesday the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference launches the Project Compassion campaign for Lent. A good hymn that matches the launch of Project Compassion is 'The Church of Christ in every age', and this hymn is mentioned in the music list for the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time in the Hymn Suggestions section of this Newsletter.

Speaking of Lent, there are a few points we need to bear in mind when preparing music for the Season of Lent. As Lent is a penitential season, the music we prepare for the liturgy during Lent should reflect this characteristic. Musical instruments should only be used to sustain singing with the exception of the Solemnities of Saint Patrick (Friday 17 March), Saint Joseph (Monday 20 March) and the Annunciation (Saturday 25 March) as well as the Fourth Sunday of Lent (*Laetare Sunday* – Sunday 19 March).

Given that musical instruments are to be used only to sustain singing with exception of the days mentioned in the previous paragraph, another way we can observe the simplicity of Lent in the liturgy is to not sing a recessional hymn but let the ministers of the liturgy and then the members of the gathered assembly depart in silence.

In Lent, the Alleluia is omitted at Mass and in the Liturgy of the Hours, even in the celebrations of solemnities and feasts. This also applies to the hymns used in the Liturgy. The Gospel Acclamation is replaced by one of these four acclamations:

-Praise to You, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

-Praise and honour to You, Lord Jesus Christ!

-Glory and praise to You, Lord Jesus Christ!

-Glory to You, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

(CWBII contains various settings of these acclamations (Numbers 54-61).)

Parishes with an active RCIA process should celebrate the Scrutinies on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent. Suggestions for appropriate music are made in the hymn suggestions for those Sundays of Lent. (See pages 21-26.)

As in previous years, I will continue to write my *A Coffee with Alessio* column. You can read that on our Facebook page. Please see the last page of this Newsletter for those details.

We also continue to prepare resources (including music) for the feast days in the liturgical calendar (Weekday and Sundays for the Seasons – Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter) as well as other Sunday feasts.

One change I have made to the Newsletter is to include pictures of the two patron Saints of music – Saint Cecilia and Saint Gregory. Their pictures are found at the end of this Newsletter. In the past I have used musical symbols and tried to have them in the colour of the Season we were celebrating in the liturgy at the time. I thought for this year, I would place the Newsletter and our work as musicians in the care of these two great Saints.

So, as we begin another year of school and work and musicians return to their ministries, let us commit ourselves to be witnesses to Christ and His Gospel by the work we do as liturgical ministers. We ask the Lord's help and blessings in all that we do, and ask Mary, His Mother (and the Patroness of this Archdiocese) to pray for us and all the work we do for Jesus, her Son.

REFLECTION

113. Liturgical worship is given a more noble form when the divine offices are celebrated solemnly in song, with the assistance of sacred ministers and the active participation of the people.

What does the preceding sentence from *Sacrosanctum Concilium* mean?

In the November 2022 edition of the Newsletter, I looked at article 112 from *Sacrosanctum Concilium* (SC) which was part of the series of articles on liturgical music. I am continuing the examination of the articles on Sacred Music from SC this month. If we look at the paragraph above, we will come to understand that the liturgy is celebrated more nobly when there is music sung by both the choir and the congregation. The Mass is more noble with music, but it must carefully rehearsed and prepared and well presented. The music sung should also be suitable. For example, we do not sing any music with Alleluia during Lent. The Alleluia returns at the Easter Vigil. The music ministers and the music chosen should serve the liturgy instead of the other way around.

In the paragraph above it does mention singing by both the sacred ministers and the active participation of the people. I will say more about that when we look at article 114 which mentions that choirs have a rightful place in the liturgy to sing on their own. For now though, we can already see that there is room for both the choir singing pieces on its own in the liturgy and also for the choir to lead pieces which the congregation joins in singing – the active participation of the people. The people need the choir to teach them music and the choir needs to know the music extremely well, so that they can lead the people in the singing at the liturgy. If the choir (or cantor) is not familiar with what they are singing, then the people will be hesitant to join in, thereby leading to a situation where the music has not given liturgical worship a more noble form.
