Preparing a Confirmation Order of Service

outline notes

Preparing the ritual outline for the Eucharist in which the Rite of Confirmation is celebrated can be challenging given that this ritual is usually only celebrated once a year and those responsible for preparing the outline may be new to the role.

To assist and streamline this process a template for the ritual outline has been developed. The order of service template is in a Word document and indicates what needs to be filled in.

It is not necessary to put into the order of service the prayers that the Celebrant alone says throughout the Mass as there are several he can choose from on the day.

The Liturgy of the Word

Choice of Readings

Scripture readings are chosen from **Lectionary III** pp.86ff "Readings for Confirmation". Readings and Presidential Prayers are not to be changed on the Sundays of Advent, Lent, the Easter Season and Solemnities.

As the dates for Solemnities will change each year you will need to check the Ordo.

At parish Masses on Sundays, the Mass of the day is normally used, and the Sunday readings respected, though the ritual Mass with its readings may be used on the Sundays of Christmas and Ordinary Time. On days when ritual Masses are not allowed, one of the readings may still be taken from those provided for the celebrations of sacrament, except Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, Corpus Christi and Assumption

Universal Prayer

Sample petitions have been included from The Order of Confirmation ritual outline that is attached (pages 16-17).

These prayers are only examples taken from 'The Order of Confirmation' pages 16-17. You may wish to adjust them to suit your community celebration.

How to Prepare Universal Prayers

The Universal Prayer or the Prayer of the Faithful is the prayer of the church for the world in general. The intercessions are not prayers of thanksgiving but petitions from the entire community placed before a loving God. The statements are short and simple but also broad and inclusive. For example, instead of praying for 'those in hospital' the petition can be broadened to 'All who suffer injury or illness especially those in hospital'.

Asking on behalf of another – has been characteristic of a heart attuned to God's mercy. The one who prays looks "not only to their own interests, but also to the interests of others," even to the point of praying for those who do you harm."

Catholic Catechism of the Church #2653

The intentions take the form of a litany. As litanies they move best when they follow a pattern.

The intention – each petition in a set should commence with the same wording.

For example:

For those whom God has called to eternal life, **that** they hear the call of the Good Shepherd as reward for their good actions in this life.

For world leaders, *that* they work together to bring about world peace and healing to those who suffer as a consequence of war and terrorism.

The reader's invitation to the assembly to respond to the prayer is by 'Lord, hear us' or similar words. **Live and Proclaim God's Word,** A Handbook for Readers in Parish and School, Archdiocese of Perth Liturgical Guidelines -Pages 11 & 12.

Other names for the Universal prayers are Prayers of the Faithful, Bidding Prayers, General Intercessions.

The Liturgy of the Word concludes with the Universal Prayers.

The Universal Prayer

from The General Instruction of the Roman Missal

69. In the Universal Prayer or Prayer of the Faithful, the people respond in some sense to the Word of God which they have received in faith and, exercising the office of their baptismal priesthood, offer prayers to God for the salvation of all. It is desirable that there usually be such a form of prayer in Masses celebrated with the people, so that petitions may be offered for holy Church, for those who govern with authority over us, for those weighed down by various needs, for all humanity, and for the salvation of the whole world.

70. The series of intentions is usually to be:

a) for the needs of the Church;

b) for public authorities and the salvation of the whole world;

c) for those burdened by any kind of difficulty;

d) for the local community.

Nevertheless, in any particular celebration, such as a Confirmation, a Marriage, or at a Funeral, the series of intentions may be concerned more closely with the particular occasion.

71. It is for the Celebrant to regulate this prayer from the chair. He himself begins it with a brief introduction, by which he calls upon the faithful to pray, and likewise he concludes it with an oration. The intentions announced should be sober, be composed with a wise liberty and in few words, and they should be expressive of the prayer of the entire community.

They are announced from the ambo or from another suitable place, by the Deacon or by a cantor, a reader, or one of the lay faithful.

68. The people, for their part, stand and give expression to their prayer either by an invocation said in common after each intention or by praying in silence.

Examples of Formularies for the Universal Prayer. from **The Roman Missal, Appendix V, page 1515**

Formula I

For..... intention. That ... prayer

For refugees and all who have fled violence, that they will be guided to places of safety and helped to rebuild their lives.

Formula II

For.... intention

Let us...prayer

For those who hold public office, let us call on the power of the Lord.

Other Examples:

For our political leaders. May they be blessed with insight and courage and seek to develop policies that serve the common good.

For people whose lives have been devastated by natural disasters. May they be given the support needed for them to rebuild their lives and communities.

Use of the Mitre and the Crosier in the Mass

Two extra Altar Ministers are required to assist with the Crosier and Mitre. They walk behind the Bishop, give a profound bow and take their seat close enough to be available when needed to assist with the Bishop's Crosier and mitre.

Crosier

As a rule, the Bishop holds the pastoral staff (Crosier) when he:

- walks in procession
- listens to the Gospel reading
- gives the Homily
- bestows a blessing on people.

Mitre

As a rule, the bishop wears the Mitre when he:

- is seated.
- gives the Homily
- greets the people, addresses them or gives them the invitation to pray.
- gives a solemn blessing
- confers a Sacrament
- walks in a procession.

The following are the times that the Altar Minister needs to be prepared to assist the Bishop:

- Entrance Procession
- Incensing of the Altar the Bishop hands the Crosier to the Altar Minister.

- After incensing the Altar: Receives Crosier to walk back to presider's chair.
- Presiders Chair: Mitre and Crosier removed at the chair.
- After the Introductory Rites and before the First Reading: the Bishop receives the Mitre.
- When the Bishop stands for the Gospel Acclamation (after he puts incense in the thurible): the Mitre is removed, and the Crosier given to the Bishop.
- During the Homily: Mitre and Crosier are used.
- Profession of Faith: Mitre and Crosier are removed.
- After the Prayer over the Gifts: the Bishop removes the skull cap and either places it on the altar or hands it to an Altar Minister.
- After Holy Communion: the Bishop places the skull cap on this head.
- Final Blessing and Recessional Procession: Mitre and Crosier are used.

Altar Ministers need to be close to the Bishop so that the Mitre and Crosier are always ready.

Anointing of the Candidates

The Chrism is brought to the Celebrant. Candidates give their Confirmation card to the Acolyte and standing in front of the celebrant , say their Confirmation name.

The Sponsor places his/her right hand on the candidate's right shoulder. The Celebrant will make the sign of the cross on the forehead of each candidate.

	For the whole world: that all people, who have one Maker and Father, may acknowledge one another as brothers and sisters, without discrimination of race or nation, and with sincere hearts seek the Kingdom of God, which is peace and joy in the Holy Spirit, let us pray to the Lord.
