
THE NATIVITY OF SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST

What can we learn from Saint John the Baptist?

John revealed Jesus to others as both the Messiah and the Lamb of God. He exemplifies the Christian life as one who proclaimed the Gospel message of healing and repentance and at the same time pointed Christ out and showed people the way to be united with God. John did not let his reputation or fame get to him, nor did he lord it over others. He knew his mission and his place and recognized that he must decrease and Jesus must increase (John 3:30). There are times in our life when things don't go the way we would like or the way we had planned. In those times, we must pray for the grace to be like Mary, let God's will be done, and trust in God to guide us along the different way he would like us to travel. COVID-19 has certainly shown us that we have to adapt. Overnight, many things we liked to do for entertainment came to a grinding halt. People lost their jobs and many things they had they planned (sometimes well in advance) went out the window. The people who survived this crisis best are those who have adapted and prayed, asking God for help, and used their time wisely to either learn new skills or lend a helping those who need it most. In this way, they have shown others God's presence and the way to follow His Son, Jesus.
