



PRESENTER

We will now begin our walk through the Celebration of the Eucharist. Deepening our understanding of the Mass will help us to participate more fully, and, as Archbishop Costelloe said in launching the Liturgical formation and renewal in the Archdiocese "we will be enriched by a renewed love for and awareness of the extraordinary gift we have in the Eucharist, in the Mass." PRESENTER Let us now begin our walk through the celebration of the Mass. The celebration of Mass, is the action of Christ and of Read quote from the General Instruction of the Roman the People of God. It is the centre of the whole of Christian life for both the universal and local church, Missal (GIRM) Slides 7 & 8 as well as for each of the faithful. **PRESENTER** It is the high point both of the action by which God makes holy the world in Christ and of the worship that the human race offers to the Father, adoring him through Christ, the Son of God, in the Holy Spirit. (GIRM 16)

Notes

A Greek word meaning 'a public work' or a 'service in the Name of/on behalf of the people' [Catechism 1069] Christian liturgies are always public celebrations or activities. Through them, believers join Jesus as he prays to God the Father for blessings upon all people

PRESENTER

Read the slide and stress the importance of liturgies being community and public activities.

Liturgy is an experience which intimately binds the purpose and meaning of Christians lives to the Life of Christ. Jesus:

'He is our way, our truth, our life.'
(John 14:6)

LITURGY

In the liturgy of the Church, more than anywhere else people find their place to stand before God. Not alone but sharing a common purpose, a common identity.

PRESENTER

Read the slide

Stress the point of the slide that Liturgy is about the Life of Jesus, where we gather as a community before God.

Notes

In the words of Vatican II, full and active participation in the liturgy by all the people is "The primary and indispensable source....of the true Christian spirit." (CSL #14)

The liturgy is "a sacred action surpassing all others," (CSL #7) the "summit toward which the activity of the church is directed" and "the fount

PRESENTER

CSL Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. It was the first document of the Vatican II and was issued toward the end of the second session. This constitution sets out the reform of the Liturgy, the liturgical books, and the very life of the Church.

Vatican II highlighted the importance of participating in Liturgy for us and for the whole Church.

Official liturgies of the Catholic Church take care that the words, gestures and symbols are authentic expressions of Christ.

Personal prayer, alone or with others is not adequate to express what it means to be fully Christian.



PRESENTER

Liturgies are always true to the Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus. Whilst it is important to pray personally it is never the same as participating in the Liturgies of the Church.

The role of Liturgy is to express the "true Christian spirit" so that, as well as enabling people to offer God true worship, they can be shaped by it in likeness of Christ.

(Through its many ritual forms, the liturgy helps people find their place before God. This is found in Christ).

PRESENTER

Through Liturgies we are shaped to be more Christlike in how we live our lives and love others.

Christ's presence helps people see their lives as they are. He speaks to people in the scriptures, proclaiming the power of the Spirit who renews the face of the earth. He looks at the assembly and smiles at them, helping them to recognise him in the most unexpected places:

"When was it that we saw you a strange, and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing?" (Mt 25:38)

LITURGY

Taking part in the liturgy of the Church is not so much about who people are, but whose they are.
They belong to Christ, and Christ belongs to God. By taking part in the liturgy of the Church, people are graced by Jesus. They answer the call to become like him, to live no longer for themselves, but for him.

The Principles of Liturgy

- The liturgy of the Church is the public worship of the whole body of Christ, both head and members.
- Liturgy is always a celebration of the paschal mystery. (Birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus)
- 3. Liturgy takes the form of ritual prayer.
- Christ is always present and active in the liturgy.
- The Word of God always has a place in liturgy.



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The Principles of Liturgy

- The whole assembly celebrates the liturgy.
- Liturgy calls for the full conscious active participation of the faithful.
- Liturgy is the summit towards which the activity of the Church is directed, and the fount from which all its power flows.



The Liturgy of the Word begins with several readings from the bible. The official documents of the Church stress the value of the scripture readings at Mass, 'When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God speaks to the people, and Christ, present in his word, proclaims the Gospel'.



The structure of the Liturgy of the Eucharist is the:

- · Preparation of the Altar and the Gifts
- · Invitation to Prayer
- · Eucharistic Prayer
- · Communion Rite
- Communion

The Liturgy of the Eucharist is the central action the memorial of the Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus.

Give the group time to read the slide quickly.



At the Last Supper Christ instituted the Paschal Sacrifice and banquet, by which the Sacrifice of the Cross is continuously made present in the Church whenever the priest, representing Christ the Lord, carries out what the Lord himself did and handed over to his disciples to be done in his memory. (GIRM 72)

PRESENTER

Stress the importance of the need for us as Catholics to have a relationship with Jesus if we are going to really appreciate the Eucharist. Ask the group to read the quote GIRM 72 to themselves.

The Concluding Rites

This is the shortest and simplest part of the Mass. According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, it consists of brief announcements (if necessary), the priest's greeting and blessing, the dismissal of the people, and the reverencing of the altar by the priest, deacon and other ministers his is the shortest and simplest part of the Mass. (GIRM 90)

Going to Mass should be a life-changing event 'Going to Mass and receiving the Eucharist should make a difference in the way Catholics live", Pope Francis said; "they should be more accepting of others and more aware of their sinfulness." "When we go to Mass, we find ourselves with all sorts of people," the pope said. "Does the Eucharist we celebrate lead me to consider all of them as brothers and sisters? Does it increase my ability to rejoice when they do and to weep with those who weep?" Pope Francis said it is not enough to say one loves Jesus; it must be shown in love for those he loved.
