INTRODUCTION

This month, we return to Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar. That term is not the best translation of the Latin in the Missal and can be misunderstood to mean that there is “nothing going on” in the Church during this time. In actual fact, what the term refers to is that we are not focusing on or celebrating any particular aspect of Jesus’ Life or Ministry. For example, during Advent, we focus on preparing for the coming of Christ at Christmas. During the Christmas Season we focus on the birth of Jesus. During Lent we enter into the desert for forty days just as Jesus did and during the Easter Season we celebrate with joy for fifty days Jesus’ rising from the dead. During Ordinary Time, the readings take us through the whole of Jesus’ earthly ministry.

Even though we have begun Ordinary Time, the first two Sundays of this month are replaced by the Solemnities of The Holy Trinity and Corpus Christi. With the music suggestions for this month, I haven’t given a full list of suggestions for the Solemnities of Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi, the Sacred Heart of Jesus or Saints Peter and Paul. For these Solemnities I have given the hymn from *Introit Hymns for the Church’s Year* and the hymn that corresponds to the Gospel Reading for the day from *Hymns for the Gospels* and listed a hymn by James McAuley and Richard Connolly which would be suitable. These hymn suggestions are listed on page 14.

Please note the suggestions for the settings of the Sequence for Corpus Christi which I mentioned in the April and May Newsletter and have highlighted in this month’s as well.

At the end of this Newsletter (see pages 29-41) I have included hymns for Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi, the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Saints Peter and Paul. Chris and I have written the hymn texts to existing tunes. We are merely offering them as a possible resource for you to use in your parish settings. We are not part of the OneLicense scheme so you will not need to report the use of these hymns. Nor are we seeking any royalties for reproducing the texts. The only thing we ask is that you acknowledge us as the authors. We hope that these hymn texts will be of assistance to you in your repertoire for these Solemnities.

With the music suggestions, you will find a full list of suggestions for the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time and thereafter, beginning on page 15.

We continue to offer workshops to parish musicians and are happy to come and visit your parish if there is a liturgical music topic that you would like further instruction or support on. Please feel free to contact me (see contact details on page 42).

I have listed the workshops for June-September on page 3.

Last month we held our Music Reading Course, which was very successful. We are always pleased to see how, over the weeks of the course, the participants grow in confidence and in their knowledge of reading a music score. Well done to all our participants!

This month we are holding our annual Psalmist Training Course. I will give a summary of that course in next month's Newsletter.

Since the beginning of the pandemic we have been preparing prayer resources for the weekday Memorials, Feasts and Solemnities. These resources give information about the feast, extracts from the liturgy of the day and a new hymn text set to an existing hymn tune. The prayer resources for June are now available from the Centre for Liturgy website. (See <https://liturgy.perthcatholic.org.au/june/>).

This month I am continuing to examine article 114 from *Sacrosanctum Concilium* – specifically on the role of choirs and the congregation in the liturgy. In previous Newsletters, I examined how the choir and the congregation (members of the gathered assembly) could fulfill their respective roles in the Introductory Rites (April Newsletter) and the Liturgy of the Word (May Newsletter). This month I am looking at how they can do the same in the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

I hope and pray that the music you provide in your communities will bring you and the members of your community much joy as we continue to celebrate the Lord's rising from the dead!

REFLECTION

114. Choirs must be diligently promoted, especially in cathedral churches; but bishops and other pastors of souls must be at pains to ensure that, whenever the sacred action is to be celebrated with song, the whole body of the faithful may be able to contribute that active participation which is rightly theirs.

What does the preceding sentence from *Sacrosanctum Concilium* mean?

The sentence reproduced above is the second part of article 114. There are those people who think choirs should sing everything on their own in the liturgy and that the people should not sing anything. Then at the opposite extreme there are those people who think that choirs should not sing anything on their own, but instead that the people should sing everything there is to sing in the liturgy. Both of these views are incorrect and are not in keeping with the Church asks of liturgical musicians.

To help us better understand what SC asks and requires, I have been referring to the General Instruction of The Roman Missal (GIRM). The Mass is divided into four parts: The Introductory Rites, The Liturgy of the Word, The Liturgy of the Eucharist and The Concluding Rites. In the past two months I have examined the Introductory Rites and The Liturgy of the Word.

This month I am examining the musical parts of the Mass in the Liturgy of the Eucharist which require singing and who should sing which part.

There are four acclamations in the Liturgy of the Eucharist: Holy, Holy, Holy, The Memorial Acclamation, the Great Amen and the Doxology after the Embolism following the Lord's Prayer. These should be sung by everyone together.

There are several dialogues, but these require to the Priest to be able to lead the singing so that the people can effectively respond to what he sings. As with the dialogues in the Introductory Rites and the Liturgy of the Word, both the Priest and People have their role to play in the dialogue. The choir or cantor can take the role of leading the people in the people's responses in the dialogues.

There is a great deal of listening that the people do during The Liturgy of the Eucharist, in particular during the Eucharistic Prayer. Just as listening to the readings in the Liturgy of the Word is a form of prayer and participation, so too listening to the Eucharistic Prayer being prayed is also a form of prayer and participation. The Priest prays the Eucharistic Prayer on behalf of the people and they make it their own by joining in the Great Amen.

There are two Processional songs – the Offertory Chant and the Communion Chant. There are several options given for how these can be sung. If the choir sings one on its own, then to balance that, the people should join in singing the other. The Offertory and Communion music are also opportunities for the cantor or choir to introduce new or unfamiliar music to the people. They can do this by singing it so that the people can hear it, learn it and become familiar with it. Of course, if the cantor or choir sing it one week as a means of introducing the unfamiliar hymn to the people and then the hymn isn't sung for several weeks that does not help the people become familiar with the tune.

The Post-Communion hymn is optional. If it is to be sung, then it should be sung by all. The choir can also play its part here by adding harmonies. Alternatively, the period after Communion can be a time of silence.
