INTRODUCTION

We are now back into the swing of Ordinary Time. I always think it's a good idea to do a stocktake of things at various points in the year. When this Newsletter is published, school holidays will have begun. This is a good time to be thinking about which pieces of music we might like to use during the Advent and Christmas Season and start sourcing and purchasing the music. During these weeks of Ordinary Time we can repeat familiar music and that allows choir directors to obtain unfamiliar music and musicians to learn this music. Christmas may seem a long time away. However, since in this country we rely mostly on volunteers to provide liturgical music and many of our choir members do not read music, we have to remember that it takes those people a lot longer to learn something than if we had professional musicians who rehearse every day.

I have given a full list of music suggestions for this month and next month (August). Please note that on Sunday 6 August, the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord will take precedence over the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time and so I have given a full list of music suggestions for this feast on pages 21-22. Also on Tuesday 8 August we celebrate the Solemnity of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop (see page 23 for Music suggestions) and on Tuesday 15 August we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (see pages 26-27 for Music suggestions).

In light of what I have mentioned above about looking ahead to the rest of the liturgical year, I thought I would give a brief description of the music workshops that we will be running here during Term 3.

Thursdays 3 and 10 August – Voice Production Workshop

In this two-week course the participants will learn good singing techniques. The topics covered will include breath control, voice placement, the sounds of singing and warm-up exercises. These are all an important part of good voice production and allow people to sing and be heard without straining their voices.

Thursday 31 August – Leading Singing Without Accompaniment

Many parishes have difficulty finding organists, keyboard players or cantors to lead, accompany and support the singing of the assembly. This workshop will consider strategies and techniques for leading the assembly in sung prayer without accompaniment and teach examples of music suitable for unaccompanied singing. These examples will provide practical and easy music resources that can be sung in parishes when no accompanist is present.

Thursdays 7, 14 and 21 September – Music Reading Course Part II

This three-week course aims to teach music reading skills to those people who have no or little understanding of reading and/or following a music score. Part I was very successful. For those people who missed out on Part I, please feel free to join us for Part II, as the first week of this course will be a complete revision of Part I.

The Psalmist Training Course held during June was very successful. The three participants who attended have grown in confidence in leading the Responsorial Psalm. We congratulate those people who completed this course. Well done!

This month I am continuing to examine article 114 from *Sacrosanctum Concilium* – specifically on the role of choirs and the congregation in the liturgy. In previous Newsletters, I examined how the choir and the congregation (members of the gathered assembly) could fulfill their respective roles in the Introductory Rites (April Newsletter) and the Liturgy of the Word (May Newsletter) and the Liturgy of the Eucharist (June Newsletter). This month I am looking at how they can do the same in the Concluding Rites.

As we continue to journey through winter, I hope and pray that you and your musicians will stay safe and continue to be able to lead your people in their worship of Almighty God with sound liturgical music!

REFLECTION

114. Choirs must be diligently promoted, especially in cathedral churches; but bishops and other pastors of souls must be at pains to ensure that, whenever the sacred action is to be celebrated with song, the whole body of the faithful may be able to contribute that active participation which is rightly theirs.

What does the preceding sentence from *Sacrosanctum Concilium* mean?

The sentence reproduced above is the second part of article 114. There are those people who think choirs should sing everything on their own in the liturgy and that the people should not sing anything. Then at the opposite extreme there are those people who think that choirs should not sing anything on their own, but instead that the people should sing everything there is to sing in the liturgy. Both of these views are incorrect and are not in keeping with the Church asks of liturgical musicians.

To help us better understand what SC asks and requires, I have been referring to the General Instruction of The Roman Missal (GIRM). The Mass is divided into four parts: The Introductory Rites, The Liturgy of the Word, The Liturgy of the Eucharist and The Concluding Rites. In the past three months I have examined the Introductory Rites, The Liturgy of the Word and The Liturgy of the Eucharist.

This month I am examining the musical parts of the Mass in the Concluding Rites which require singing and who should sing which part.

As we can see from the table above the amount of music in The Concluding Rites of the Mass is very minimal. There are two dialogues and as with the other dialogues in the Mass, these require to the Priest to be able to lead the singing so that the people can effectively respond to what he sings.

There is no mention of a Recessional Hymn in the GIRM and as such it is optional and it can be sung by the people or the choir, or the choir alone. An organ postlude can also be played instead of singing a hymn. During Lent, silence is a good option to employ so that the liturgy reflects the austerity of the Season being celebrated.
