#### INTRODUCTION

In last month's Newsletter, I gave a list and brief explanation about each of the workshops that we would be running during August and September. I thought it would be a good idea to repeat that because the workshops will cover topics about which we often receive requests from parish musicians for assistance.

#### Thursday 31 August – Leading Singing Without Accompaniment

Many parishes have difficulty finding organists, keyboard players or cantors to lead, accompany and support the singing of the assembly. This workshop will consider strategies and techniques for leading the assembly in sung prayer without accompaniment and teach examples of music suitable for unaccompanied singing. These examples will provide practical and easy music resources that can be sung in parishes when no accompanist is present.

#### Thursdays 7, 14 and 21 September – Music Reading Course Part II

This three-week course aims to teach music reading skills to those people who have little or no understanding of reading and/or following a music score. Part I was very successful. For those people who missed out on Part I, please feel free to join us for Part II, as the first week of this course will be a complete revision of Part I.

In October we will be running a workshop on music for Advent and Christmas. During this workshop we will teach the Christmas Proclamation and the Epiphany Proclamation. People might think we only have an Easter Proclamation. However, we have two more which are very easy to sing and should be sung in our liturgy. The workshops we held earlier in the year on the Easter Proclamation were very successful and we hope that this workshop which will include the Proclamations for the Christmas Season will be just as successful.

In last month's Newsletter, I finished examining article 114 from *Sacrosanctum Concilium*. The discussion on that article centred around what the people can and should sing and what the choir can and should sing on its own. There is room for both congregational singing as well as for the choir to sing on its own in the liturgy. This month, I am examining article 115 and looking at how formation for liturgical musicians is an important and integral part of that ministry.

### REFLECTION

115. Great importance is to be attached to the teaching and practice of music in seminaries, in the novitiates and houses of study of religious of both sexes, and also in other Catholic institutions and schools. To impart this instruction, teachers are to be carefully trained and put in charge of the teaching of sacred music.

It is desirable also to found higher institutes of sacred music whenever this can be done.

#### What does the preceding article from Sacrosanctum Concilium mean?

After reading the above article from SC, we might think that what it is asking does not apply to us. However, I think we can extend the need for training to ourselves as liturgical music ministers. As leaders in this ministry, we need to know what music is appropriate in the liturgy, when it is appropriate for the choir to sing on its own and when it should be leading the people. We also need to be familiar with the music we will be playing or singing so that we can teach and lead our fellow musicians and they in turn can lead the people.

Here at the Centre for Liturgy we run several workshops a year on teaching music for the various seasons and feasts in the liturgical year. We also run workshops on teaching people how to read music as well as a course on preparing people to be able to lead the singing of the Responsorial Psalm. We run courses on teaching people how to sing and project their voice and how to be able to lead music without accompaniment. Of course, we then have that most dreaded of all topics which we as liturgical musicians need to be aware of – copyright.

The whole purpose of these workshops is so that the music in the parishes fits the liturgy and is in accord with both Sacrosanctum Concilium and the General Instruction of the Roman Missal. It is one thing being able to read music or sing, it is a completely different thing to know when to play music in the liturgy and what to play. Liturgical musicians need both the musical and the liturgical knowledge.

So, whilst most people in the music ministry in parishes are not going to be members of a Religious Order, a seminarian or a priest, all music ministers need to understand the importance of the skills and knowledge required of them as liturgical musicians to lead the people in their worship of Almighty God.

Chris and I are happy to help teach your communities music you are unfamiliar with or give support in other areas for example copyright or teaching people how to lead the singing of the Responsorial Psalm.
