INTRODUCTION

During the month of May we continue to celebrate the Easter Season. Hence, I have kept the gold borders in this Newsletter and the image of the Paschal Candle on the next page. Yes, Alleluia is our song of joy that we sing during Easter, giving thanks to God the Father that He raised His Son Jesus from the dead so that we might have eternal life. One of the beauties of the Easter Season is that we can repeat some of the music from Easter Sunday. We don't need to keep learning new music. By repeating some of the music from Easter Sunday, the musicians and the people will gain confidence in singing this Easter music as they repeat it and become more familiar with it, and this lightens the load for people as well.

With the music suggestions, you will find a full list of suggestions for the Sixth Sunday of Easter as well as the Eleventh, Twelfth and Thirteenth Sundays in Ordinary Time. I haven't given a full list of suggestions for the Solemnities of the Ascension of the Lord, Pentecost, Sunday, Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi or the Sacred Heart of Jesus. For each of these Solemnities, I have given the hymn from Introit Hymns for the Church's Year and the hymn that corresponds to the Gospel Reading for the day from Hymns for the Gospels and listed a hymn by James McAuley and Richard Connolly which would be suitable. These hymn suggestions are listed on pages 16-17.

Please note the suggestions for the settings of the Sequences for Pentecost Sunday and Corpus Christi which I mentioned in last month's Newsletter and have highlighted in this month's Newsletter as well. These are also listed on pages 16-17.

There is a reminder on page 3 that music by David Haas should not be used. This is followed by list of songs composed by him which have been popular in the past and a second list of songs that can be used as alternatives or replacements.

We continue to offer workshops to parish musicians and are happy to come and visit your parish if there is a liturgical music topic that you would like further instruction or support on. Please feel free to contact us (see contact details on page 26).

I have listed the workshops for May-July on page 3. This month we begin the Music Reading Course. This course is an introduction to the basic principles required to read music. We have found this course helpful to people in the past and so thought we would offer it again this year. At the end of this month and going into June, we will hold our annual Psalmist Training Course. If you have always desired to lead the proclamation of the Responsorial Psalm (by singing it) but haven't had the opportunity to do so or haven't felt confident then this course is for you!

People who would like to do the Psalmist Training Course, but cannot read music, should consider doing the Music Reading Course before the Psalmist Training Course.

There will be a charge for attendance at these courses, \$30 per person for the Music Reading Course and \$40 per person for the Psalmist Training Course. These charges will cover the production of handouts for the courses.

Going forward, there will be a charge of \$10 per person attending a workshop to cover the cost of printing materials.

This month, the Reflection considers articles 28 and 29 from *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, with particular reference to the roles of music ministers in the proclamation of the Responsorial Psalm.

I hope and pray that the music you provide in your communities will bring you and the members of your community much joy as we continue to celebrate the Lord's rising from the dead!

A REMINDER ABOUT MUSIC BY DAVID HAAS

From time to time, we receive enquiries about using music by David Haas in the liturgy. In 2021, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference made the decision that the use of his music in Australia should be discontinued. The Bishops have recently renewed this decision and have asked that musicians and other parish ministers should be reminded of the decision.

This is an opportunity for musicians to consider adding some pieces to their repertoire to replace the music by David Haas that can no longer being used. The first table below list songs by David Haas that can no longer be used and the following table suggests alternatives to them.

We may need to make amendments to the proposed schedule as circumstances arise, but we will keep you posted about any changes we need to make.

REFLECTION

As the Psalmist Training Course will be beginning in June, I thought it would be helpful to reflect on articles 28 and 29 from SC, with particular reference to the role of the psalmist.

In liturgical celebrations each person, minister or layman, who has an office to perform, should do all of, but only, those parts which pertain to his office by the nature of the rite and the principles of liturgy.

29. Servers, lectors commentators, and members of the choir also exercise a genuine liturgical function. They ought, therefore, to discharge their office with the sincere piety and decorum demanded by so exalted a ministry and rightly expected of them by God's people.

Consequently they must all be deeply imbued with the spirit of the liturgy, each in his own measure, and they must be trained to perform their functions in a correct and orderly manner.

What do the preceding articles from Sacrosanctum Concilium mean?

The article above says "who has an office to perform". However, I think a better turn of phrase would be "who has a ministry to exercise", since ministers do not "perform"; for example, proclaiming of the Responsorial Psalm is not a "performance activity".

The psalmist, or, if no psalmist is available, the cantor or choir members leading the proclamation of the Responsorial Psalm must be very familiar with the music for both the response and the verses. The same applies to the organist. In this way, the musicians will exercise their ministry in a correct and orderly manner and with decorum.

Similarly, it would be helpful for the cantor to rehearse at the ambo with the organist well before the liturgy so that they can ensure that they are able to make contact with each other, that they can hear each other, that the organ is not overpowering the cantor, and that the sound system is functioning properly, so as not to disturb the people's prayer by unpleasant noises because the psalmist is singing too close and/or too loudly into the microphone. All these points will ensure that each musician is fulfilling their ministry correctly and that they are helping people pray to God and worship Him and as such they are serving the liturgy.
