INTRODUCTION

This month, we return to Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar. The term "Ordinary" is not the best translation of the Latin in the Missal and can be misunderstood to mean that there is "nothing going on" in the Church during this time. The term is better translated as referring to the time when the weeks of the liturgical year are numbered. During Ordinary Time, we are not focusing on or celebrating any particular aspect of Jesus' Life or Ministry. For example, during Advent, we focus on preparing for the coming of Christ at Christmas. During the Christmas Season we focus on the birth of Jesus. During Lent we enter into the desert for forty days just as Jesus did and during the Easter Season we celebrate with joy for fifty days Jesus' rising from the dead. During Ordinary Time, the readings take us through the whole of Jesus' earthly ministry.

Even though we have begun Ordinary Time, the first Sunday of this month is replaced by the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. As we go into Ordinary Time and Winter and come to a slight hiatus in major liturgical celebrations (at least as far as Sundays are concerned), now is a good time to perhaps look ahead to the second half of the year and consider whether there may be any new pieces you would like your musicians and/or congregation to learn. In doing so, you might like to think ahead to Advent and Christmas as well. Mindful of limitations on people's time and that it does take time also for people to learn new music, probably two to three new pieces between now and the end of the year, would be more than enough. Once the musicians have learned the music, the next step is introducing it to the congregation and they need to have heard it a couple of times before joining in with it themselves. Thereafter, they need to sing it two to three times so that they can learn and then feel comfortable singing it. At least five Sundays need to be spent in the choir teaching it to the people and then the people learning it.

With the music suggestions, you will find a full list of suggestions for the Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time and thereafter, beginning on page 18.

We continue to offer workshops to parish musicians and are happy to come and visit your parish if there is a liturgical music topic that you would like further

instruction or support on. Please feel free to contact me (see contact details on page 34).

I have listed the workshops for July-September on page 4. They include a workshop on copyright, and two workshops in which we will teach participants Roger Heagney's Festival Mass.

Last month we held our Music Reading Course, which was very successful. We are always pleased to see how, over the weeks of the course, the participants grow in confidence and in their knowledge of reading a music score. Well done to all our participants!

REFLECTION

As the Psalmist Training Course will be beginning in June, I thought it would be helpful to reflect on articles 28 and 29 from SC, with particular reference to the role of the psalmist.

28. In liturgical celebrations each person, minister or layman, who has an office to perform, should do all of, but only, those parts which pertain to his office by the nature of the rite and the principles of liturgy.

29. Servers, lectors commentators, and members of the choir also exercise a genuine liturgical function. They ought, therefore, to discharge their office with the sincere piety and decorum demanded by so exalted a ministry and rightly expected of them by God's people.

Consequently they must all be deeply imbued with the spirit of the liturgy, each in his own measure, and they must be trained to perform their functions in a correct and orderly manner.

What do the preceding articles from Sacrosanctum Concilium mean?

I have repeated the same two articles from SC that were in last month's Newsletter as there are a couple of other points I would like to add about singing the Responsorial Psalm.

Since each person is only supposed to fulfill the ministry and the parts that pertain to a particular ministry, if we consider the role of the congregation in singing the Responsorial Psalm, their role is to sing the response. Therefore, the tune of the response should be easy enough for people to sing after they have heard it twice, firstly by the organist and then the psalmist singing it. If the tune is so difficult that after hearing it twice people aren't able to catch on and join in singing then it is probably best to find another setting of that response.

Before we get to the people though, the psalmist and the accompanist must be familiar with the music for both the response and the verses. If they are not familiar with the music, the psalm may not be sung correctly and then it will be impossible for the people to learn the response.

The Psalm is both the Word of God and so it should be proclaimed, but it is also a poetic song and as such it should be sung.


