## **INTRODUCTION**

We are now back into the swing of Ordinary Time. I always think it's a good idea to do a stocktake of things at various points in the year. When this Newsletter is published, school holidays will have begun. This is a good time to be thinking about which pieces of music we might like to use during the Advent and Christmas Season and start sourcing and purchasing the music. During these weeks of Ordinary Time we can repeat familiar music and that allows choir directors to obtain unfamiliar music and musicians to learn this music. Christmas may seem a long time away. However, since in this country we rely mostly on volunteers to provide liturgical music and many of our choir members do not read music, we have to remember that it takes those people a lot longer to learn something than if we had professional musicians who rehearse every day.

I have given a full list of music suggestions for this month and next month (August), including the Solemnities of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop (Thursday 8 August – see page 23) and The Assumption of Mary into Heaven (Thursday 15 August – see page 26).

At the end of this month we begin the five-Sunday discourse on the Eucharist. This is an opportunity for you to use hymns specifically about the Eucharist in your repertoire and perhaps repeat later in the year as Communion hymns.

The Psalmist Training Course held during May and June was very successful. The participants who attended have grown in confidence in leading the Responsorial Psalm. We congratulate those people who completed this course. Well done!

One of the topics covered at the Psalmist Training Course was a description of the different types of Psalms. We will be using this topic for the Reflection each month for the rest of the year.

Speaking of workshops, you can see the list of workshops for July-September on page 3. We will be repeating the Psalmist Training Course in August. This course will be held north of the river.

At the end of this month we will hold our annual copyright workshop. This is my least favourite topic, I would much prefer to be teaching people to sing a piece of music. However, as best as we can, we need to understand and follow copyright law. Chris and I will do our best to explain everything you need to know in terms you understand. If you aren't sure about your copyright obligations, then this workshop would be a good one for you to come to.

In September, Chris and I will present two workshops on a Mass setting which is very easy to learn and use. We will hold one workshop north of the river and one south. Hopefully, repeating workshops will allow a greater number of people to attend.

As we continue to journey through winter, I hope and pray that you and your musicians will stay safe and continue to be able to lead your people in their worship of Almighty God with sound liturgical music!

## REFLECTION

After the Psalmist Training Course in May and June, we thought it would be helpful to reflect on article 24 from SC, with particular reference to the psalms in the liturgy.

*24. Sacred scripture is of the greatest importance in the celebration of the liturgy. For it is from scripture that lessons are read and explained in the homily, and psalms are sung; the prayers, collects, and liturgical songs are scriptural in their inspiration and their force, and it is from the scriptures that actions and signs derive their meaning. Thus to achieve the restoration, progress, and adaptation of the sacred liturgy, it is essential to promote that warm and living love for scripture to which the venerable tradition of both eastern and western rites gives testimony.*

### **What does the preceding articles from *Sacrosanctum Concilium* mean?**

In recognition of the importance of Scripture in the celebration of the liturgy, the Responsorial Psalm was reintroduced into the Mass replacing the Gradual Psalm, so that the Psalms would become more familiar to the faithful. Over the coming months we will reflect on the Psalms.

The Book of Psalms contains one hundred and fifty psalms which are prayers, poems and songs, all in one. As the psalms are part of Scripture, they have to be proclaimed, in the same way as the other three readings at Mass. As they are songs they should be sung.

The subject matter of the psalms ranges over many different topics. There are, however, a number of common themes that make it possible to group them into various types. Recognizing the type of a particular psalm helps us to understand it and proclaim it well. Over the coming months, we will look at the types of psalms.

This month we will look at the *Laments* and *Songs of Thanksgiving*.

People are most likely to turn to God and pray for help when they are in trouble. The Laments are the psalms which express this need. They are the most numerous of the types of psalms. There are individual laments, which refer to the situation of a single person – sickness and injustice for example – and community laments, which refer to the situation of the nation such as war and famine.

These psalms begin with a cry to God, calling for His attention. This is followed by description of the cause of the current distress. At the end, the mood changes from complaint to praise, an acknowledgement that the prayer has been heard and answered. Psalms 21(22), 24(25), 30(31), 34(35), 59(60), 53(54), 73(74) and 136(137) are examples of Laments.

The Songs of Thanksgiving express gratitude for deliverance by God. They may have been used liturgically when a thanksgiving sacrifice was made after some saving experience. The introduction of the psalms is a statement of intent to give thanks to God. This is followed by a description of the situation in which God's help was sought and the way in which God acted to bring about salvation. Like the Laments, there are psalms for both individual and community thanksgiving. Psalms 29(30), 64(65), 65(66), 135(136) and 137(138) are examples of Songs of Thanksgiving.
