INTRODUCTION

This Newsletter is somewhat different in that it covers the three months of August-October. This is a one-off situation. There will be a November Newsletter and of course the December-January Newsletter will be ready for December with all the various resources for the Advent and Christmas Season.

This month we continue with four Sundays where the readings are focused on the Eucharist. This is a good opportunity for us to revisit our music repertoire that focuses on the Eucharist.

During this month we also celebrate the Solemnities of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop and the Assumption of Mary into Heaven. I have repeated those music suggestions from last month's Newsletter. There are music suggestions for each of the Sundays for this month as well as September, October and November. Since there will be no Newsletter until November, the music selections go right up until the Solemnity of Christ the King (see page 52). The music suggestions for November also include the Solemnity of All Saints (Friday 1 November - see page 43) and the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed (Saturday 2 November - see page 45). The November edition will include all these suggestions as well those for the Season of Advent which begins on Sunday 1 December.

Last month, we started a series of reflections on the types of Psalms and linked that to the paragraph from Sacrosanctum Concilium. We have continued the series in this month's Newsletter. There is also a prayer for each of the months of August, September and October.

Next month, Chris and I will run two workshops on a new Mass setting, which is very easy to learn and use. We will hold one workshop north of the river and one south. Hopefully, repeating workshops will allow a greater number of people to attend. We will also teach the hymn for the Jubilee year which will begin on Christmas Eve and conclude on the Feast of the Epiphany in 2026.

This time of year is a good time to look ahead to Advent and Christmas and start thinking about what 'new music' you may like to introduce so that your musicians

are very familiar with it so that they can adequately lead the people in their sung worship.

If you would like Chris and me to run a workshop on a particular aspect of music in the liturgy or training your musicians, we are more than happy to do so. Our contact details are on page 53.

REFLECTION

After the Psalmist Training Course in May and June, we thought it would be helpful to reflect on article 24 from SC, with particular reference to the psalms in the liturgy.

24. Sacred scripture is of the greatest importance in the celebration of the liturgy. For it is from scripture that lessons are read and explained in the homily, and psalms are sung; the prayers, collects, and liturgical songs are scriptural in their inspiration and their force, and it is from the scriptures that actions and signs derive their meaning. Thus to achieve the restoration, progress, and adaptation of the sacred liturgy, it is essential to promote that warm and living love for scripture to which the venerable tradition of both eastern and western rites gives testimony.

What does the preceding articles from *Sacrosanctum Concilium* mean?

The Book of Psalms contains one hundred and fifty psalms which are prayers, poems and songs all in one. As the psalms are part of Scripture, they have to be proclaimed, in the same way as the other three readings at Mass. As they are songs they should be sung.

The subject matter of the psalms ranges over many different topics. There are, however, some common themes that make it possible to group them into various types. In this series of reflections, we are looking at the types of psalms.

In the first reflection we considered the *Laments* and *Songs of Thanksgiving*. In this reflection we will look at the *Hymns* and *Psalms of Confidence*.

The Hymns are songs of praise to God. They begin and end with a call to the listeners to praise God, and in between the reasons why God is to be praised are proclaimed. The Hymns are statements of God's continuing presence and action in the world. Psalms 8, 28(29), 32(33), 97(98), 103(104), 134(135), 148 and 150 are examples of Hymns.

The Psalms of Confidence are expressions of trust in God. They assert that God hears our prayers, that he loves us and acts for our good and that he is more powerful than any creature. The Good Shepherd psalm (22(23)) is the best-known example of a Psalm of Confidence. Other examples include Psalms 4, 15(16), 61(62), 90(91), 120(121) and 130(131).
